Tarantulas and large grasshoppers are out, as well as the snakes. Our neighbors, Kim and Bart, killed a rattlesnake near their back door a couple weeks ago. The dog alerted them to it being there. It is a time to be watchful when outdoors.

Lots going on right now here on the NTMA center. The hanger has a lot of activity with planes being repaired or refurbished. They are working on getting the Cessna 206 ready for Brazil. The Cessna 182 is almost ready to go to Indonesia, and the Cessna 185 McNeal trainer is a long way into being repaired

The new facility for guests, funded by a church in Tennessee will be dedicated next month, and it almost has all the finishing touches on it.

Thank the Lord for the first believers in the Mwinika tribe of Mozambique, Africa. Some of the Mwinika people are also learning to read and write and will soon be teaching others.

Last, but not least, please pray for our daughter, Kari and family in Mexico. This past week, they were shopping in a nice part of town when they heard shots, and saw a man with a gun. Two government officials were being chased by the cartel, and the chase and gun fight happened to end right where Clif, Kari and the kids were shopping. Clif and Kari grabbed their three kids and got inside of a store and went to the back of the store, along with a lot of other frightened people. One of the government officials was killed. The cartel men got away. Kari and Clif have been debriefed by the contingency folks there, and they seem to have weathered it well, but it was a very frightening time for them all. The cartel are not targeting foreigners, and many that have been there for many years have never seen any violence. Kari and Clif are grateful for the contingency training they have had; which keeps them very watchful, and taught them to do what they needed to do.

Much to leave in the Lord's hands as we depend on Him daily for all He has for each of us.
