We have had some record breaking low temperatures this winter, and frozen pipes for many in the area, We then had temps back in the 70s and then a couple weeks ago it snowed. Actually it's 70 degrees today. In between people have been watering their lawns and the farmers are out preparing their fields for planting. In fact some have had crops in for quite a number of weeks already.

The weather doesn't seem to make much difference in the amount of illegals that are coming through this area. As Dan was working outside a few weeks ago. he saw Boarder Patrol stopped a car along the highway. Three illegals jumped out and ran into the field near our house, with Boarder Patrol in pursuit. They caught two of them, and one got away. Soon after a Boarder Patrol helicopter was overhead looking for illegal # 3. We don't think they found him.

Dan has quite a bit of work at the office at present. He is working on projects to go on the website. Projects for aircraft needs for overseas church plant teams, and also aircraft projects here for the training of pilots. Also as a part of the crisis management team revamping and updating things involving personnel overseas and our personnel right here at McNeal.

Nancy has had good check-ups, and is now trying out a compression pump to take down the swelling in her right arm caused by lymphadema. We are seeing some improvement.

Please remember our kids, Kari, Clif and family, as they continue to prepare for going to Mexico in June. We have many concerns, as they do, but so far the Lord, in many ways, is encouraging them on. They continue to be in contact with contingency folks in Mexico as well as NTM's worldwide contingency experts.

Praise the Lord for a new airstrip being opened in Papua New Guinea. The Cessna 206 has recently landed for the first time on the airstrip built by 4 tribal villages.

A prayer by Imi, a Uriay tribal lady in Papua New Guinea who recently trusted Christ as her Savior.
